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

Upgrade options in Alice Springs include Pyndan Camel Tracks, the Spirit of Mount Gillen Helicopter Flight or the sensational Alice Springs and Surrounds Fixed Wing Scenic flight (additional fee applies).







These highly specialised vehicles are used by the Australian Military and are renowned all over the world for their reliability, capability and comfort. Inside, the vehicles are fitted with coach seats (all forward facing) and have considerably more headroom and legroom compared to more everyday 4WD vehicles.

The G-Wagon fleet is split into two groups of 5 vehicles; one group being for the Canning Stock Route and the other for the Simpson Desert. Each group consists of three 6WD and two 4WD vehicles. The 6WD G-Wagons are particularly impressive and are used to carry the supplies and amenities that make the journey possible, including a custom-made pod that houses 2 hot-water showers and 2 flushing toilets.

BARRAMUNDI LODGE

Features include luxury furnishings, a private balcony, ensuite bathroom and on-site restaurant.

Arnhem Land Barramundi Lodge is the premium fishing destination in the Northern Territory, with unique recreational fishing licences allowing access to many pristine river systems and various other coastal locations.



MURWANGI SAFARI CAMP

Overlooking the vast Arafura Swamp, Murwangi is an area of immense cultural significance and is one of the most spectacular settings in Arnhem Land.

Outback Spirit's exclusive Murwangi Safari Camp was developed in consultation with Traditional Owners and the Northern Land Council. Featuring 12 deluxe 'Safari Suites', the camp is positioned in an arc that overlooks the stunning wetlands of the enormous Arafura Swamp. Each safari suite features an ensuite bathroom, luxurious furnishings, air-conditioning and a balcony from which to admire the view. A state-of-the-art kitchen and restaurant serves as the hub of the camp, where an in-house chef prepares outstanding cuisine.



PUNGALINA SAFARI CAMP



Outback Spirit's safari camp is one of only two permanent camps on Ngauwudu and is the most luxurious and spacious. Each beautifully furnished 'Safari Suite' features its own ensuite bathroom, 240volt solar power, full insect screening, crisp laundered linen and comfortable beds. The safari suites also feature a wide veranda with outdoor furniture, perfect for relaxing during the day or night. Best of all, they're situated near a pristine palm fringed creek, your own private swimming hole.



BUNGLE BUNGLE SAVANNAH LODGE

Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge is the most established accommodation within the World Heritage Listed Purnululu National Park (the Bungle Bungles). Located in the south of the park on Bellburn Creek, the lodge features 28 architecturally designed cabins scattered in a bush setting. There's also a licensed restaurant and outdoor bar area overlooking the creek, an ideal spot for a cool drink at the end of the day. 
In 2017 Outback Spirit became a 50% owner of the Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge, in partnership with Aviair in Kununurra.







SAL SALIS NINGALOO REEF

WHERE THE OUTBACK MEETS THE REEF... WITH JUST FOURTEEN ECO-LUXE WILDERNESS TENTS AND ONE HONEYMOON TENT HIDDEN AMONGST THE DUNES OVERLOOKING NINGALOO REEF, SAL SALIS PROVIDES A UNIQUE PLACE FROM WHICH TO EXPLORE WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S CORAL COAST AND ONE OF AUSTRALIA'S BEST KEPT NATURAL SECRETS.

The camp lies amongst the sand dunes with the coral reef and its marine residents just a few metres off shore. 
BY AIR

Qantas fly daily to Exmouth (Learmonth) with connections from most capital cities. Air and road transfers are available from RAAF Learmonth Airport (LEA) and must be pre-booked. Guests can self-drive to the camp; from Perth, it is 1330 kms/13+ hours. The drive from RAAF Learmonth Airport (LEA) is 90 minutes and from Exmouth town it is 1 hour.

GUIDED GORGE WALKS

EARLY MORNING WALKS INTO THE CAPE RANGE PROVIDE A RUGGED AND BEAUTIFUL CONTRAST TO THE REEF AND BEACH ACTIVITIES.

Guided walks usually depart before sunrise while temperatures are cooler, and take in Mandu Mandu Gorge and Yardie Creek Gorge. Keep an eye out for land mammals including red kangaroos, echidna and black-footed rock wallabies. Emus are also frequently sighted through the national park.

SEA KAYAKING

GUIDED FORAYS ACROSS THE REEF REVEAL AN ARRAY OF COLOURFUL RESIDENTS – FISH, SEA TURTLES, REEF SHARKS, RAYS AND CORALS.

Kayaks are the perfect vessel for exploring the Reef and you will be shown how to do so without interference to the ecosystem. Our guided kayak-snorkels take you further offshore where we drop an anchor in the sand to snorkel some of the deeper lagoons. The lagoons in the Reef are some of the best snorkelling spots on Ningaloo Reef - look out for soft corals, sponges, wobbegong sharks and hundreds of marine fish. Between August and October, you'll see humpback whales migrating along the coast, just metres beyond the Reef.


SWIM WITH THE WORLD'S LARGEST FISH

EACH YEAR BETWEEN MID-MARCH AND JULY THESE SLOW-MOVING, GENTLE, FILTER-FEEDING GIANTS MIGRATE PAST NINGALOO REEF.

Sal Salis offers whale shark swims with select local partners for an additional cost. This needs to be pre-booked as the boats do fill up months in advance.

Your whale shark experience begins with a transfer to Tantabiddi Boat Ramp (about 25 minutes' drive) where you will meet your experienced skipper and crew for the day. Morning tea is usually served as you motor out into the Indian Ocean to begin the search, aided by a spotter aircraft that relays sightings to our skipper. The crew will help you get kitted out with the proper equipment, and will also provide a thorough briefing.

During the course of the day your crew will keep an eye out for turtles, dolphins, dugongs, rays and sea birds plus there is usually time for a snorkel at the back of the Reef. A delicious lunch featuring fresh Western Australian produce is provided too.
